OVERVIEW

RESPONSIBILITIES

The afterschool leader will:

- Assist the afterschool lead teacher in instruction, distributing materials and providing for the needs of all children in our care.
- Assist in the development of lesson plans with afterschool lead teacher.
- Able to communicate effectively with both students and parents.
- Assist in the implementation of lesson plans in accordance with Grace Bible Academy's selected curriculum and in accordance with state licensing regulations.
- Complete an annual professional development plan to identify areas of growth during the school year.
- Responsible for maintaining accurate meal records for the food program.
- Maintaining accurate attendance record for afterschool program.
- Responsible for completing the required 15 hours of professional development annually.
- Create a loving afterschool setting that displays the love of Jesus Christ in words, actions, and attitudes for all children.
- Effectively discipline children in accordance to God's Word (Hebrews 12:4-12).
- Review all curriculum used by Grace Bible Academy and ensures they are consistent with the church's doctrinal commitments.
- Be responsible for continual evaluation of kindergarten students and recommend remediation as necessary.

- Complete an annual professional development plan to identify areas of growth during the school year.
- All other duties as assigned by Director

REQUIREMENTS

- A high school diploma or GED required at minimum.
- A desire to teach and mentor children in biblical truth.
- A growing Christian faith and character.
- Ability to pass a background check.
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills.
- Understanding of and willingness to serve within the doctrinal commitments of the church.

- A lifestyle congruent with the biblical requirements for leaders (1 Tim. 3:1-13; 2 Tim. 2; Titus 1:5-9).
